**REQUIREMENTS TO PARTICIPATE:**

1. The applicant must be a citizen of Australia at the time of application;
2. The primary intention is a holiday in Uruguay for up to 12 calendar months, with work being incidental rather than the primary reason for the visit;
3. To be aged between 18-30 years, both inclusive, at the time of application for temporary residency;
4. To have completed at least 2 years of undergraduate university study or hold tertiary qualifications;
5. To have a level of proficiency in Spanish which is assessed to be at least functional. Proof of this must be provided on application, or alternatively the Spanish language evaluation will be done during a personal interview at the Embassy or Consulate;
6. Not be accompanied by dependent children;
7. Have not previously taken part in Uruguay's "Work and Holiday" program.
